MISSION:

Our mission is to empower children, teens, adults, and families to adjust to life after the loss of a loved one within a supportive community of their peers and to promote healthful grief, healing, and growth.

VISION:

Our vision is to restore a sense of hope for the future to children and families who have lost a loved one and to establish Children's Bereavement Center's model of peer support as the best practice model of child and family bereavement services.

PEER GRIEF SUPPORT GROUPS

About CBC Groups

CBC provides free-of-cost, weekly, year-round peer grief support groups that provide a safe space for individuals over the age of four to heal and build resilience after the loss of a significant person. CBC provides a total of 17 peer grief support groups, including dedicated groups for parents who have lost a child of any age and another group for parents who experience a loss during pregnancy or infancy. Adult groups are offered in English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole.

96% of group participants reported that CBC services are beneficial.

Participants in our grief support groups displayed statistically significant reductions in emotional grief and nonacceptance of loss, along with substantial growth in recognizing personal strength, identifying new possibilities, and healthier coping strategies, including increased positive reframing and decreased self-blame.

About CBC Outreach

Through community outreach, CBC builds strong relationships with schools, health care providers, faith-based organizations, nonprofit organizations, and other community-based agencies to address the impacts of grief and loss by connecting individuals and families to our free programs. Our six Outreach Coordinators deliver presentations throughout the year to organizations across South Florida, particularly in high-need communities, in order to reduce barriers and increase access to essential grief support for children, teens, adults, and families.









Outreach By the Numbers

83 presentations facilitated to increase awareness of grief support resources.

4 Connect and Remember Together events hosted across South Florida, engaging 250 participants in meaningful art and music therapy activities. These events raised awareness and helped reduce barriers to accessing our free grief support programs.

300 individuals engaged in meaningful dialogue and connection through our "Conversations with CBC" series.

22,198 community members served across South Florida through community outreach programming.

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT



Centro Campesino

CBC partnered with Centro Campesino to host a bilingual Connect and Remember Together event in Florida City, providing culturally sensitive grief support, resources, and school supplies to over Spanish and Haitian Creole speaking children, teens, and families. in South Miami-Dade.



CBC in the Community

Through our community-based initiatives, CBC has formed impactful partnerships across Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties to bring grief support services directly to the community. Grounded in our Healthful Grieving Model, children engage in therapeutic activities centered around self-awareness, empathy, positive peer relationships, and positive coping skills following the loss of a significant person.

CBC in Schools

Through our school-based programming, children learn how to understand and work through complex emotions, such as anxiety and grief through healthy outlets, including art and mindfulness activities. CBC partnered with Arts4Learning to offer after-school programming with tailored psychoeducational activities for 4th and 5th grade students at Finlay Elementary School in Miami.

CBC in the Faith-Based Community

CBC partnered with churches, synagogues, and community centers across South Florida including Zion Lutheran Church, CARE, Sweet Home Church, Mt. Calvary Baptist Church, Aventura Turnberry Jewish Center, Temple Sinai, and Beth Torah. In collaboration with Mishkan Miami under the Greater Miami Jewish Federation, CBC expanded our grief support programming through an "Extended Shiva Project" which served over 325 individuals.

CBC in the Children's Village in 2025

In 2025, CBC will open its first partnership site at the Children's Village at Lotus House in Overtown, joining a collective model with 11 other community partners. Together, we are building a supportive network that addresses the educational, mental, emotional, and basic needs of children and families in the community. Through this partnership, CBC will provide on-site grief support, outreach services, training, and psychoeducational programming for children, teens, adults, and families residing in Miami-Dade County's highest-need communities.



GRIEF INFORMED TRAINING



CBC offers grief-informed training, tailored education, and consultation services for health care agencies, schools, and nonprofit organizations throughout South Florida. Our programs address the unique ways grief manifests across different stages of life and provide practical approaches to compassionate, effective grief support within diverse multicultural contexts, both individually and in community organizations.

By the Numbers

225 community and school-based professionals trained, including behavioral health staff and counselors from the School District of Palm Beach County

90% of professionals trained by CBC integrate CBC's grief support strategies into their professional roles, leading to direct referrals to CBC and the creation of ongoing support networks within schools, healthcare systems, and nonprofit organizations, ensuring accessible grief support for our community.

309 individuals increased their grief literacy through CBC's "Lunch and Learn" forums, which provide grief education for professionals. These forums, led by renowned experts, focus on pressing issues impacting South Florida and offer additional ways to support grieving children, teens, adults, and families who may otherwise lack access to grief care.



The most beneficial part of the CBC training is learning about how everyone deals with grief differently and the importance of self-care when dealing with this population. This is a great training and I think it should also be offered to other mental health professionals, along as with an educator format for educators.
